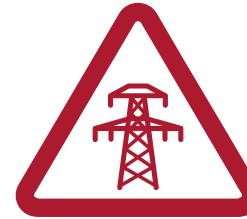

More than 5.5 million people in Haiti need humanitarian assistance, including more than four million people who are in need of food aid. More than one million children are not able to attend school. The eruption of gang violence on 29th February in the capital Port-au-Prince has worsened an already disastrous situation. Half of the medical facilities in the capital are not able to function. Thousands are internally displaced, and many others cannot leave their homes, go to work or seek medical treatment due to the violence on the streets. Universities, schools, hospitals, prisons and banks, as well as critical businesses and government infrastructure, have been attacked. The impact of the current crisis comes on top of repeated natural disasters and a cholera outbreak across the whole country.
