A flash flood hit the Rasuwa district of Nepal on 26 August 2026, sweeping away homes, buildings, roads and bridges. At least 1,000 people have lost their lives and, while search and rescue efforts continue, more than 4,000 people are still missing. Access to many areas is severely limited with roads and bridges impassable. More than 65,000 people are in need of emergency provision of clean water and sanitation as well as food, shelter and other essential supplies. Many health facilities and schools have been badly damaged and the government have declared a flood emergency in 15 municipalities.
